#### Ottawa commits \$326M for B.C. infrastructure:

Funding through the Canada Community-Building Fund will support housing-related projects, parks, transit, and water systems, with \$1.6B allocated over five years.

The federal government is investing \$2.5M in Burnaby waste-to-energy expansion: Metro Vancouver's facility will supply low-carbon heating to 50,000 homes, cut emissions by 70,000 tonnes annually, and become North America's largest district energy system.
